

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






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


This global heat map shows how temperatures are soaring across the planet. Source: Climate Reanalyzer, Climate Change Institute, University of Maine, USA.



Internationalisation of Higher Education for Society (IHES) explicitly aims to benefit the wider community, at home or abroad, through international or intercultural education, research, service and engagement.



Bridging the gap between social engagement & internationalisation




Universities have always been engaged with society through different concepts (e.g. community outreach, social engagement, service learning)

We observe a strategic disconnect of social responsibility/engagement from internationalisation












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Internationalisation 1.0

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

Method

Survey for HEIs
213 responses
69 activities from 48 HEIs analysed

Focus Groups

Regional Authorities





State of IHES? Results and Recommendations

Higher Education – challenges

- Local target groups were significantly more represented than their international counterparts – be they school pupils, migrants/refugees, public service providers or civil society and youth (whose representation is slightly higher than others).
- Incoming academics, students and administrative staff are generally much less involved in the activities than their domestic colleagues.



State of IHES? Results and Recommendations



Civil Society and Regional governments

- Most relevant goals included: developing global citizens, supporting the UN Sustainable Development Goals and the education of the general public/capacity building and knowledge transfer.
- Regional representatives see potential for more and better cooperation with higher education actors, in particular regarding climate and environmental challenges.
- Partnering with CSOs: There is a need to discover how best to work together, especially when it comes to field expertise. Building trust is crucial, and that there is a need to recognise civil society's work.



State of IHES? Results and Recommendations

Recommendations

- "One possible way forward would be the strategic diversification of target groups affected by activities at a given HEI."
- Including service to society in performance metrics would change this by providing incentives for international staff to engage in relevant activities at their host institutions.




